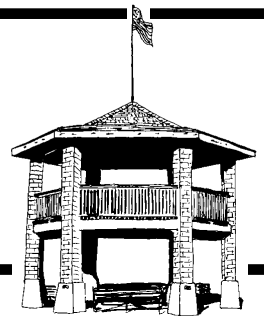

Milo City Council was called to order by Mayor Hall at 7:00 p.m. Council answering roll call: Kinser, Moulds, and Uttley. Graham and Mason were absent. Mason joined the electronic meeting at 7:10 pm.

Motion by Kinser to approve the agenda. Second by Uttley. Ayes: Kinser, Moulds, Uttley. Nays: none. Absent: Graham and Mason. Motion approved. Motion by Uttley to approve the consent agenda to include all council meeting minutes of March 2, March 16, and April 6, 2020; and accounts payable from March 3 – April 20, 2020 in the amount of \$127,006.67; February 2020 and March 2020 Bank Reconciliation Reports; February 2020 and March 2020 Warren County Sheriff's Report; Certificate of Deposit Update; Local Option Sales Tax Update. Second by Kinser. Ayes: Kinser, Moulds and Uttley. Nays: none. Absent: Graham and Mason. Motion approved. Mason arrived at 7:10 pm.

## Mayor's Update

I am pleased to share some great news. The City is benefitting from two grants for a new electronic welcome sign on the west side of Milo. Hometown Pride was awarded \$5000 from Warren County Philanthropic Partnership and an \$8000 grant from Warren County Economic Development Corp. Local contributions also showed a lot of community support for this project: \$500 each from Country Propane, Milo 4th of July, Inc. and Southeast Warren Community Schools, \$200 from SEW Partners in Education, and \$100 each from Hometown Pride, Milo Lions Club, and Community Projects, Inc. Look for it to be installed later this summer.

Warren County Philanthropic Partnership also awarded grants to the Milo Library for STEM activities in the amount of \$500, Milo Fire Department for \$5,000 for Personal Protective Equipment and the Milo Lions Club for \$5,000 for the Dan Nash Memorial Playground at Centennial Park. We are so grateful for these grants and the community support!

As the situation with COVID-19 changes on almost a daily basis, I would like to direct you to the City's official Facebook page for the most current information—just search "City of Milo". Details that relate to the City, school and community are posted there.

As we continue to re-open here as well as around the state and country, please continue to follow the guidelines set out by the Iowa Department of Public Health and the Governor. Your understanding and efforts are appreciated during these unprecedented times.

Call 811 Before you Dig

811 is the national number designated by the Federal Communications Commission to help protect homeowners and professional excavators from unintentionally hitting underground utility lines while working on digging projects – large and small.

Every digging project requires a call to 811. Hitting an underground utility line can harm the environment, cause serious personal injuries, disrupt service to an entire neighborhood and potentially incur fines and repair costs. Some common examples of when to call 811 are: installing a rural mailbox, putting up a fence, planting trees or shrubbery, building a patio or deck, excavating a new garden area, etc.

## Southeast Warren Community Schools Update

On June 15, high school baseball and softball games may begin unless circumstances dictate a change in date. The following mitigation efforts are required to help ensure player, coach, and spectator safety during games: No one should attend or participate in games if they currently have symptoms or have been in contact with anyone with a confirmed COVID-19 diagnosis in the last 14 days. No shared drinking fountains, water stations, or coolers may be used. Schools must limit the use of bleachers for fans. Encourage fans to bring their own chairs or stand. Fans should practice social distancing between different household units and accept personal responsibility for public health guidelines. Fans must not attend if they have symptoms of illness. No concessions stands are permitted.

The Southeast Warren school year has concluded for the 2019-2020 school year. We wish to thank our teachers and staff for their ability to change, learn and grow the skills needed to switch to online

learning. You may know that our teachers and staff have still been working during the pandemic. What you may not know is that many of them have been doing work that is outside of their normal skill set. Our staff has been preparing, packaging, and delivering lunches for students in our community; volunteering at the SEW Food Pantry – unloading groceries from the Food Bank of Iowa, prepacking boxes, passing out food; mowing the school grounds, weed eating, updating and redoing flower beds; setting up Chrome Books and Hot Spots and distributing them; packing up student's personal property and distributing it, including extra reading books to promote summer reading; volunteering at the Elzora Town Daycare and assisting Daycare students with online school; packaging school supplies and donated dental supplies to be distributed to students; painting the school hallways and inside the school buildings and more things behind the scenes.
