

MINUTES of the CITY OF MILO COUNCIL MEETING
DUE TO THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC CRISIS THIS MEETING WAS HELD ELECTRONICALLY
CITY HALL, 100 MAIN ST, MILO, IOWA - MONDAY, JUNE 15, 2020

Milo City Council was called to order by Mayor Hall at 7:00 p.m. Council answering roll call: Kinser, Moulds, Graham, Uttley and Mason. Pledge of allegiance was tabled because this meeting was held by electronic means.

Motion by Kinser to approve the agenda. Second by Moulds. Ayes: Kinser, Moulds, Graham, Uttley and Mason. Nays: none. Motion approved. Motion by Mason to approve the consent agenda to include all council meeting minutes of May 4 and May 18 and June 1, 2020; and accounts payable from May 19 – June 15, 2020 in the amount of \$43,094.89; and May 2020 Warren County Sheriff's Report. Second by Moulds. Ayes: Kinser, Moulds, Graham, Uttley and Mason. Nays: none. Motion approved.

Under old business, Mayor Hall stated there is no new information from Hall Engineering regarding the wastewater treatment facility improvements.

Departmental reports consisted of Doug Hembry sharing that street patching is ongoing and asphalt resurfacing will be later this year. Hembry said that he obtained an estimate for asphaltting the alley behind the Milo Locker but is still awaiting details from the asphalt company. He also said they have been working on the parking layouts for the Milo Locker for handicap parking, etc. Hembry said water leak detection is ongoing.

Under new business Council discussed the unclear intersection at South bound 3rd Street and West bound Main Street. Discussion followed with Council sharing ideas. Tabled and Doug will gather more information. Next, Council discussed purchasing an emergency generator to replace the current 35 plus year-old emergency generator at the Milo Community Center. Discussion followed. Motion by Graham to approve moving forward and having Doug Hembry check into an emergency generator for the siren only and check into an emergency generator for the building. Second by Mason. Ayes: Kinser, Moulds, Graham, Uttley and Mason. Nays: none. Motion approved. Mayor Hall shared that the City Council will return to our normal meeting schedule on July 6, 2020.

There were no public comments. Councilwoman Moulds asked about mowing the grass in various areas of town. Discussion followed and Hembry will follow-up. City Clerk shared that the FFA teacher, Alex Rodger's and his students along with Sue Thompson weeded and cleaned the Centennial Park Garden. Thanks for volunteering your time and talent. The Safety and Health Committee discussed the hand out "Say No to Distracted Driving Handout".

Motion by Moulds to adjourn at 7:22 p.m. Second by Mason. Ayes: all present. Motion approved.
